As I write this column, work continues on the electric system replacement. Powerlines Inc, our contractor has been doing an excellent job and everything is on schedule to open July 1st. The new system is a huge boost to our park and I think everyone will be pleased with it.

Long term seasonal staff has started work and have been very busy painting, cleaning, mowing etc. to get the non camping areas of the park ready to open for day use on Memorial Day

Out With The Old, In With The New

Early last September the inevitable happened at Scusset campground. After years of intermittent power failures due to overtaxing a system installed in the 1970's; it finally quit for good. The remaining weeks of the 2014 season went on without electric power at the sites. Weekend winter camping was canceled. DCR was quick to act in providing emergency funding for the engineering design work and getting contractors for a new upgraded electrical system; an approximately 1.2 million dollar expenditure. This has resulted in a system capable of handling the electrical demands of 21st Century recreation vehicles.

The harsh winter we experienced left many with doubts that work could begin in early Spring, but this proved wrong. Excavation began in late March and has proceeded on schedule with few, if any, setbacks. Conduit has been installed, back-filling completed and wires pulled. Many of the 50-30-20 amp pedestals are in place. Transformer installation, finish grading and soil stabilization will complete the project.

DCR has announced that half the campground sites will be available July 1st and the rest of the campground sites will open on August 1st. Safari field campouts dates have been announced. One electrical pedestal has been run to the safari field (located near the water spigot) . We thank the DCR for their quick action in bringing the campground back on line (short term it was frustrating for the campers, but long term it will mean a continuous and ample supply of electric power resulting in happy campers).

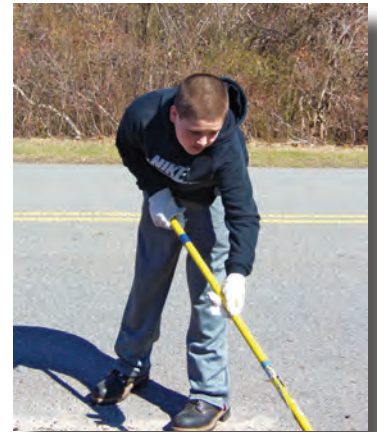
President's Corner:

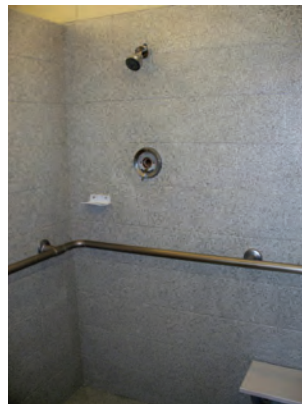
